Информационное письмо д-ра Честера Натуневича

I am writing to inform you of a project being initiated by the «Classical Bulletin», an American journal of Classical scholarship that has been published since 1925, and currently appears semi-annually from Bolchazy –Carducci Publishers, 1000 Brown Street, Unit 101, Wauconda, Illinois 60084.

The project will be a recurring feature of the «Classical Bulletin», and will be entitled «The Other Side of the Classics». This feature will contain brief reports and descriptions of recent publications produced by Classical scholars in the countries of Central and East Europe that were formerly part of the Soviet bloc, including the Soviet Union itself. Its purpose will be to provide Classicists in the West with an introduction to, and better knowledge of, the work of their colleagues in a region whose accomplishments, though many and outstanding, have not had much exposure to our part of the world. These reports will be written by the authors of the original publication themselves and should be brief, not exceeding 150 words in length. They may deal with works in the authors' own languages or in other languages. It is, however, preferable that the reports themselves be written in English. They may be submitted in other languages, such as French, Italian, German, Russian, Polish, or Czech; if this happens I will have them translated into English prior to publication and have the translation approved by the original author. Each report should be accompanied by the usual bibliographical data (author's name, title of work being reported, journal title (as applicable) with specific volume and page numbers, publisher, date and place of publication) and information about the author himself/herself (academic rank and title, and institutional and/or e-mail address).

We invite all Classical scholars in Central and East Europe to send in these reports, and would appreciate both yourself/yourselves writing a report on some work of your own and communicating my information about the «Classical Bulletin» project to other Classical colleagues at your educational institution, your city and country. The works discussed in the reports should be substantial – monographs, journal articles, editions, translations, surveys, festschriften, biographies and other tributes/memorials to scholars, accounts of recent/current work in the Classics in the country of the author, transactions and proceedings of scholarly meetings – in short, any publication in the Classics that is likely to be of interest to colleagues in the West. We encourage contributions from specialists in the ancient Greek and Latin languages and literatures, ancient Greek and Roman history and geography, art and archaeology (including epigraphy and numismatics), philosophy, religion, science, palaeography and textual criticism, and other areas of research dealing with the Greek and Roman worlds. Again, we see this as an initial step for Classicists in Central and East Europe, both those already well established and emerging younger scholars, to become more familiar names and establish professional ties with people in the West.
